To support implementation of the Western Australia's <u>Plan for Plastics</u>, the WA State Government has partnered with us, the Boomerang Alliance, to deliver our **Plastic Free Places** program, operating in Western Australia as **WA Plastic Free**.

In a nutshell, Plastic Free Places is a hands on behaviour change program that works directly with food retailers, events, markets and other organisations to assist them to switch from single-use plastics to better alternatives, such as reusable (preferred) or certified compostable items.

We differ from other sustainable cafe initiatives by working directly with the business owners in person, in a coaching / consulting capacity. Our program offers targeted advice that leads to lasting and empowering change for business owners & their staff. Our coordinators from across Australia have a wealth of knowledge and experience, with a dedicated research and communications team behind the scenes supporting them.

about Plastic Free Places

Plastic Free Places is run by the Boomerang Alliance. We are the peak community not-for-profit organisation working on waste minimisation and recycling in Australia, formed in 2003 and currently comprised of 51 national, state and local allies. We research key issues, develop policy, undertake education, and campaign for best practice laws and programs by government and business.

Plastic Free Places is the hands on element of our organisation. It is a behaviour change program that works directly with food retailers, events, markets and other organisations to assist them to switch from single-use plastics to better alternatives, such as reusable (preferred) or certified compostable items.

But... that's just the beginning. We also work with state governments, councils, suppliers, manufacturers, waste transport operators and composters to deliver real solutions to the issues we face.

On top of this our aim is to inspire our community members to make changes in their own life and support those businesses that do too.

WA Plastic Free is our Western Australian chapter of the Plastic Free Places program. We currently operate in various other communities Australia wide. This latest instalment of WA Plastic Free comes with the introduction of the single-use plastics bans and builds on our previous trials in Bassendean & Victoria Park in 2019/20.

Target items

We targets the six most littered food & beverage packaging items. It goes beyond the WA single-use plastic ban. A business is awarded Champion status once they've eliminated these plastic items.

- Plastic Water bottles
- Any thickness plastic **bags**
- Plastic Coffee cups & lids
- Plastic Straws
- Plastic Takeaway Containers
- Plastic Cutlery & other food ware (including plastic cups, plates etc.)

We work within businesses current supply chains to make switching easier, while also encouraging & assisting them to explore reusable options.

Our approach

- 1. We work in person with businesses to find the best solution of their situation. Our coordinators are essentially waste consultants that specialise in hospitality.
- 2. We utilise a participants existing supply chains (where possible) to make the transition as smooth as possible for them.
- 3. We work on implementing waste avoidance & reusable systems first and more most. For all single-use options we recommend certified compostable products (packaging) and have specific steps for water bottles.
- 4. We offer additional Champion Coaching programs for the more sustainably aware/advanced businesses, ensuring they strive for continual improvement. Eliminating takeaway single-use plastics is the start of the journey. Once they reach Champion status we offer them the chance to enrol in the Reusable Champion course (intensive one-on-one coaching & a PR campaign) as well as a Back-of-House Plastics course to work on improving kitchen operations.





How to support engagement

To ensure that the program is successfully implemented in your area we have a number of tried and tested methods for getting word out to prospective participants.

Where Councils & local community groups have worked with us to effectively communicate the program, we have had the most success. The stand out example for us is working with the Cairns Regional Council, who have stepped up to offer their full support to ensure the program is a success locally. As a result 131 businesses in the region have joined the program.
